Learning experience. The Hale Outdoor Learning Adventures program (Team H.O.L.A) uses the scenic environment as an outdoor classroom for the 41 rising 4th graders. Students are currently writing an H.O.L.A. newsletter that features a “by the numbers” section – detailing the number of steps and time it takes to move from one part of the reservation to the next. Also, students write “how-to” guides about swimming and ropes courses after partaking in the activities. Additionally, a “floating classroom” allows students to gather and examine data on Noanet pond. It’s a prime example of utilizing a beautiful outdoor setting to infuse academics and enrichment. And it all adds up to a summer of learning and fun for Russell, Grew, and Clap students!



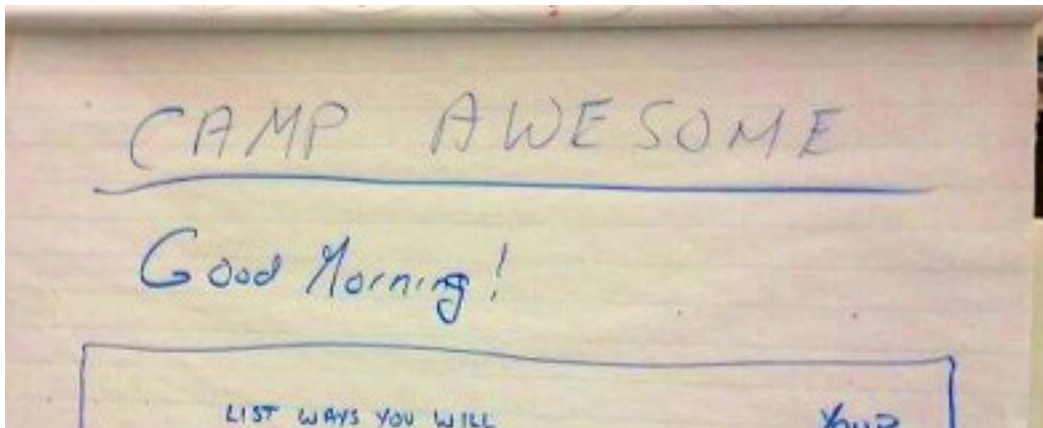

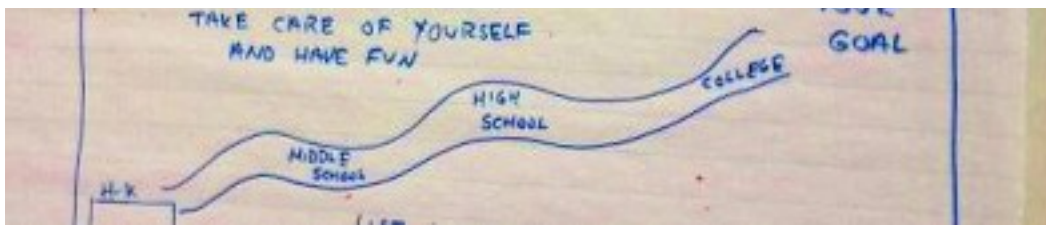
NEW Opportunities include:
